Inflation pay rise shows the way forward for the union

By the end of September all members of Prospect in BT will have received a pay award of at least 5.5% and up to the current level of inflation of 7% following managers 1.5% distribution of the pay bill for those eligible. This may be a top up for those who got an interim rise in January or a belated increase for others after BT conceded Prospect's point that there must be a pay rise for ALL.



Of course, the skills of the union's pay negotiators played a part in what is the biggest pay rise for managers and professionals in BT for many years. However, they were informed by the decisions of the union's BT Conference in May where the views of members and branches on pay priorities were both discussed and democratically agreed.

But the key factor in this has been what the union's members in the offices and workplaces did. Stretching back to the Back to the Table campaign in 2022 when BT imposed an unagreed pay rise, it became clear during pay talks that the sheer volume of issues raised by members about pay and the impact of a cost of living crisis. This made BT realise that they must negotiate with Prospect with a view to getting a satisfactory agreement, and thanks to the members that is what the union got.

Where now?

The lesson here is that what union members do and say makes a real difference. The more members we have the bigger the difference we can make.

If you know of people in your area who have yet to join Prospect now is the time for a friendly word about why they are getting a good pay rise at the end of September and how they can help by joining.

The future of BT

With a new CEO due in January 2024 and continuing media discussion about what the future of BT is, Prospect will be active this autumn in making the case for why BT as a UK owned company with the skills of union members is essential to the economy.
