Members ballot agrees BT cost of living payment, but union continues to seek longer term solutions

The members ballot on BT's cost of living payment has agreed BT's cost of living payment which benefited Prospect will be members paid up to £50K. Prospect's position was and remains that all members should benefit. Hence our campaign and discussions with BT around the cost of living continues.

After prolonged pressure compression of ranges. from Prospect BT have agreed to pay an allowance of £24 to **Business Needs drivers**

while it continues to work on a long term solution to the issue of mileage rates. This is a further part of the cost of living jigsaw that the union is pressing BT to complete.

In January 2023 returning to the issue of increasing pay ranges, now often well below market rate, with inflation at 10% plus. We will also be looking at issues BT has created by restricting the cost of living payment to those paid up to £50K around

Prospect has welcomed Philip Jansen's statement that working three days in an office location is a philosophy not a diktat. The union's view continues to be a pragmatic one.
